

· Delivering a minimum of: 50 Mbps download and 10 Mbps upload for wired technologies; 25 Mbps download and 5 Mbps upload for wireless technologies

Internet Trust

- Exceeded its original target of 95%.
- ~102,000 homes and businesses have access to high-speed internet through the project. ~99% coverage
- ~103,000 homes and businesses were identified as underserved when the Internet for Nova Scotia Initiative project started.
- ~approximately 75% had access at that time



Costing & Funding

MODY Example

- 1. Pinkney's Point and Hebron Business Park ~\$91,000 MODY \$\$\$
- 2. Carelton/Kempt ~\$260,500 MODY \$\$\$
- 3. Main Shore/Carelton/Pleasant Valley etc. ~\$278,000 MODY \$\$\$

Approaching 95% of all current civic addresses with Fibre Optic Internet to the home/door committed; Completed 2024

Total approximate Municipal Investment of \$629,500 on project value ~\$9.9 million with an average 7.12% municipal subsidy per civic address!
